



THE AWARD

Dr. Martín Villar (Valencia, Spain 1922-2011) was a world-renowned hematologist, who pioneered the treatment of hemophilia in Spain. In 2007, as a tribute to his career, and to honor his contribution to the management of hemophilia, Grifols established the Martín Villar Awards Program, with the aim of identifying and supporting innovative clinical and scientific work that offers a greater insight into haemostasis. Originally, awards were given to the top three published papers as determined by the jury. More recently, two awards have been given every year – one for clinical research and one for basic science research. The award has been recognized as a prestigious acknowledgement of research work and is well known among experts.

Beginning with the 2017 edition of the Martín Villar Awards, we are pleased to introduce a new concept for the Awards. The change in scope of the award, is to support new and promising research proposals. This modification provides an opportunity to award financial support for new research projects.

OBJECTIVE

The Martín Villar Haemostasis Awards aim to promote the realization of innovative ideas and visions in the field of blood coagulation disorders (Haemophilia and Von Willebrand Disease). The Program will offer 2 awards of EUR 50,000 each for 1 project in Clinical Research and 1 project in Basic Research to applicants whose proposals best match the program's objectives, as assessed by an independent review committee.

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CANDIDATURE REQUIREMENTS

Scientists or clinicians with innovative ideas relevant to hemostasis and blood coagulation disorders research are invited to submit their application. Applications are encouraged from both individuals and teams who may be conducting research at hospitals, universities or independent institutions.

Applicants must submit an original research contribution to basic or clinical research in haemophilia or von Willebrand disease. Projects should be related to pathology or management with plasma-derived protein therapies in general, not associated with one particular commercial product.

Applicants must present a focused project with goals that can be achieved within 12 months.

Applicants must be employed or supported by a hospital, university or independent institution.

Participants must submit a Letter of Intent (LOI), including:

- Brief resume or CV (of all investigators for a team application)
- Protocol summary

Primary applicant must be under the age of 40 at the time point of LOI submission.

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
APPLICATION PROCESS
